Literacy Goals 2007-2008

- ❑ To have 75% of students reading at grade level by the end of June 2008.

 - ❑ *Primary – Grade 3:* Students will produce three pieces of writing in different genres. All students will edit their work using a common, grade-specific/rubric and 80% of students will be able to spell 20 grade specific words correctly.
 - ❑ *Grade 4 – 6:* Students will produce three pieces of writing in different genres. All students will edit their writing using a common, grade-specific checklist/rubric and 80% of students will have at least five revisions, with 80% spelling accuracy after self-editing.

Literacy Goals 2007-2008
